Irvington, NJ--Marzmade Mobile Tattoo Studio, established by Retired U.S. Army Staff Sergeant Daniel Wright, Jr., has received national acclaim for using tattoo art therapy to help veterans with PTSD. However, The Presidential Volunteer Award recipient is traversing the nation to bring the love of custom black and gray tattoos to all ink aficionados that find themselves at the white sliding doors.

Ink Origins

During a deployment to Iraq, Wright was wounded in action and received the Purple Heart prior to retiring from the U.S. Army in 2014. He faced many challenges when transitioning out of the military but discovered through an art therapy program that Art helped him cope with the wounds of war.

Marzmade Studios was founded to support the mental health of its founder and now seeks to expand that mission to tattoo enthusiasts across America. What was started as a small business with a converted bus, traveling between New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, became a way to share joy and the love for art with clients along their respective journeys.

“Needing a way to provide for his family and manage his PTSD, Marz decided to try his hand at his first love, Art. And what form of art is profitable today? Tattooing that’s what! Marz dove in headfirst and never looked back.”

“I bought a sprinter and converted it myself to a mobile tattoo studio,” begins Wright AKA Marzmade D’Martian when speaking on the beginnings of the studio. “Started tattooing as a form of therapy, now Marzmade tours the U.S. with many tattoo conventions and comic-cons.”

The acquisition and conversion of a Mercedes-Benz Sprinter, known in entertainment circles for its use as a shuttle bus, has allowed Marzmade Mobile Tattoo Studio to broaden its geographic

scope. After touring the world with award winning musicians, a Sprinter was a familiar mobile space that would soon help him jumpstart his duty for service.

Growth Ink

Tat fans can experience the range of Marzmade body art at festivals, conventions, and private events. A plan to franchise the Marzmade Mobile concept is thought to be a better direction for the brand than a traditional brick and mortar tattoo shop.

The ability to bring the art of tattooing to the customer has translated to unscripted TV where features on VH1 Black Ink Crew and Black Ink Crew Chicago have brought Marzmade into homes (and later clients into the studio). Marzmade Mobile Tattoo Studio's international demand to pull up for friends, family, and newlyweds is increasing.

"Work hard and believe in yourself. "No" never killed anyone. Be yourself because there is no better person to be You better than YOU," are Marzmade quotes for success. The work ethic and calling for service has led to multiple local accolades for community service, up to national honors from the President of the United States of America.

Ink Initiatives

The Department of Veterans Affairs documents that 41 percent of veterans screen positive on at least one of the mental health screening tools measured in VA Facilities. After serving 14 years in the armed forces, Marz sees this work of helping vets cope with the trauma of battle as an extension of previous service.

The Wright-guided art therapy initiative donates free tattoos to wounded veterans, aids in peer-to-peer mentorship programs, and collaborates on veteran suicide prevention projects with its nonprofit organization.
